# Storage for Pictures, Textiles & Clothing

• With unlimited variation in size, but with minimal depth, the safe storage of a large collection of paintings, pictures or textiles presents a different problem. The solution is a system of mesh racks suspended from the ceiling or from a selfsupporting structure. Using smooth running tracks, energy absorbingbuffers and self braking systems these racks offer a high density andsafe storage facility that can be extended when required.

here are two types of modular picture racking and the choice of system depends heavily on the location and construction of the storage space available. The two types are:

#### Mobile base mounted

- · Most space efficient system
- · Least intrusive to fabric of the building
- Can be integrated into other storage types (i.e. it can be next to mobiles with shelves on for storage of different types)
- · Easiest to relocate
- Lockable

### Overhead supported with concealed floor guide (Pull out)

- · Best aesthetics
- Unobstructed access in walkways
- Eliminates weight bearing on floors
